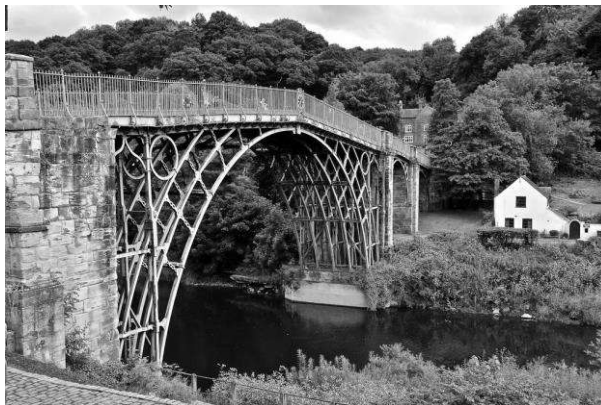

## Trumpet and Trombone Demonstration



One of the Shropshire Music Service tutors, Reuben, called into school to demonstrate the trumpet and trombone during assembly recently. The pupils really enjoyed hearing a few tunes and asked some great questions: "Why is the trombone so long?" "Why is the trumpet called a trumpet?" "Why do you have to blow air tightly through your lips to make a noise?"

Many pupils enjoy music lessons in school, all of which are delivered the talented SMS tutors. Both small group and individual lessons are available for violin, brass, drums, piano/keyboard, guitar, recorder, flute and singing. Most instruments can be started from Year 2/3, with the exception of flute which is recommended from Year 4.

## The Atherton Trust

---

*The late Mr Samuel Atherton, many years ago, lived at Nobold House, Nobold, Shrewsbury. He was a colliery proprietor. He died in 1933. His estate was left in trust for his family until his last surviving daughter died in 1981.*

*It was at this time that The Atherton Trust was created.*

*Mr. Atherton had directed in his will that the Trust should operate for the benefit of the residents in the parishes of Pontesbury and Hanwood and the village areas of Annscroft and Hook-a-Gate. These areas are now known by different names but, to all intents and purposes, the area covered remains the same.*

*Grants are made to deserving causes, either individuals or organisations in the designated area. Over the period of the Trust, there have been over 230 applications, resulting in 130 grants totalling over £120,000.*

*Applicants are required to complete a form when applying for a grant. This is available on the school website<sup>3</sup>. All applications are treated in strict confidence.*

## Free School Transport

Is your child attending the nearest and/or catchment primary school and living two miles or more from school? If so, they may be entitled to receive free school transport. Please read through the guidance notes below and following that, should you wish to apply, please follow the link below.

You can apply for either free school transport at a community school or school transport assistance on denominational (religious) grounds

In order to be eligible to receive free school transport the following criteria must normally be met:

- The pupil must be ordinarily resident in Shropshire
- The pupil must be in attendance at either the nearest, or catchment area school and live more than 2 miles away (for primary aged pupils) or 3 miles away (for secondary aged pupils). Distances are measured using the shortest pedestrian route between the home and school.

## Might your child qualify for Free School Meals and Pupil Premium?

---

*If your child is eligible for 'free school meals' and you register them for this, we'll receive extra funding called 'pupil premium'. We use this extra money to improve the educational provision and resources at the school. Please check if you may qualify - even if your child is in YR/Y1/Y2 and receives a free meal under Universal Infant Free School Meals as we get an extra £1,455 for every eligible pupil who is registered for free school meals. This extra money could make a real difference to the quality of education we offer.*

    - *Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999*
      - *The guaranteed element of Pension Credit*
  - *Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)*
    - *Working Tax Credit run-on*
  - *Universal Credit, provided you have an annual net earned income not exceeding £7,400 (£616.67 per month)*
    - ***How do I register?*** *You only need to register once at the school.*
